**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW INITIAL  
DETERMINATIONS TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION AS TO SEVERAL  
RESPONDENTS BASED ON CONSENT ORDER STIPULATIONS AND CONSENT  
ORDERS; ISSUANCE OF CONSENT ORDERS**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review initial determinations (“IDs”) (Order Nos. 13-19) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) terminating the above-captioned investigation as to respondents DT Trading Inc. of Alhambra, California; JL Concepts Inc. and Stehlen Automotive, both of Walnut, California; Wenzhou Kouvi Hardware Products Co., Ltd. of Zhejiang Province, China; SyneticUSA of Pico Rivera, California; and Topline Autoparts, Inc. and Velocity Concepts Inc., both of Hacienda Heights, California (collectively, “the consent order respondents”) based on respective consent order stipulations and consent orders. The Commission has issued the respective consent orders.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on February 15, 2019, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Extang Corporation and Lauramark Enterprises, Inc., d/b/a BAK Industries, both of Ann Arbor, Michigan. 84 FR 4534-35. The

complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain pickup truck folding bed cover systems and components thereof by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. D620,877; 7,188,888; 7,484,788; 8,061,758; 8,182,021; and 8,690,224; and U.S. Trademark Registration Nos. 5,104,393 and 3,904,016. The Commission's notice of investigation named numerous respondents including the consent order respondents. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations ("OUII") is also a party to the investigation.

On March 27 and March 29, 2019 complainants and each consent order respondent filed individual joint motions to terminate the investigation as to each consent order respondent based on a consent order stipulation. On April 2, 2019, OUII filed individual responses supporting each motion.

The ALJ issued the subject IDs (Order Nos. 13-19) on April 12, 2019, granting the joint motions for termination as to the consent order respondents. The ALJ found that the consent order stipulations and consent orders satisfy the requirements of Commission Rule 210.21(c), 19 CFR 210.21(c). He further found, pursuant to Commission Rule 210.50(b)(2), 19 CFR 210.50(b)(2), there is no indication that termination of this investigation as to each consent order respondent based on the individual consent order stipulation would adversely impact the public interest. No party petitioned for review of the IDs.

The Commission has determined not to review the IDs and has issued the respective consent orders.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 CFR part 210.
