**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL  
DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION WITH RESPECT TO  
CERTAIN ASSERTED PATENTS**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 35) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) granting an unopposed motion to terminate the investigation with respect to the asserted claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,831,306 and 10,319,812.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on October 19, 2022, based upon a complaint filed on behalf of Daedalus Prime LLC (“Daedalus”) of Bronxville, New York. 87 FR 63524-25 (Oct. 19, 2022). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain semiconductor devices, mobile devices containing the same, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent No. 9,831,306 (“the ’306 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 10,319,812 (“the ’812 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 10,700,178; and U.S. Patent No. 11,251,281. The Commission’s notice of investigation named as respondents Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. of Suwon-si, Gyeonggi-do, Republic of Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company Limited of Hsinchu City,

Taiwan; and TSMC North America of San Jose, California. *Id.* at 63525. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“Staff”) is also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On June 2, 2023, Daedalus filed a motion pursuant to Commission Rule 210.21(a)(1) (19 CFR 210.21(a)(1)) seeking to withdraw its allegations in this investigation with respect to the ’306 patent and the ’812 patent. On June 7, 2023, Staff filed a response in support of the motion.

On June 9, 2023, the ALJ issued the subject ID granting the motion. The ALJ found that the motion complied with the Commission’s rules and no extraordinary circumstances prevent the granting of the motion. No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The asserted claims of the ’306 patent and the ’812 patent are hereby terminated from the investigation.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on July 10, 2023.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
