**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION SETTING THE TARGET DATE FOR COMPLETION OF THE
INVESTIGATION AT EIGHTEEN MONTHS**

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 3) setting the target date to complete the above-captioned investigation for July 10, 2024, eighteen months from publication of the Federal Register notice of institution.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On January 10, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. of the Republic of Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; Samsung Research America, Inc. of Mountain View, California; and Samsung International, Inc. of Chula Vista, California. 88 FR 1404-05 (Jan. 10, 2023). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of components for certain environmentally-protected LCD digital displays and products containing same by reason of infringement of one or more of claims 1-4 and 11-13 of U.S. Patent No. 7,948,575; claims 1-3 and 6-9 of U.S. Patent No. 8,111,348; claims 1, 2, and 5 of U.S. Patent No. RE45,117; claims 1, 10-12, and 16-19 of U.S. Patent No. 8,842,253; and claims 1-4 and 6-13 of U.S. Patent No. 8,223,311. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named Manufacturing Resources International of Alpharetta, Georgia as the sole

respondent. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was not named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*


On January 11, 2023, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 3) setting an eighteen-month target date for completion of the investigation. The ALJ set an 18-month target date due to the “Court’s schedule and responsibilities in other investigations.” ID at 1. Given that the target is more than 16 months, the ALJ issued the order as an ID. See 19 CFR 210.51(a)(1).

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for completion of the investigation is set for July 10, 2024, and the deadline for issuing the final ID is March 8, 2024.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on February 8, 2023.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
