**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW
AN INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 22) of the presiding chief administrative law judge (“CALJ”), extending the target date for completion of the investigation from November 4, 2024, to November 5, 2024.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On July 3, 2023, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Efficient Power Conversion Corporation of El Segundo, California. 88 FR 42756–77 (Jul. 3, 2023). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain semiconductor devices, and methods of manufacturing same, and products containing the same by reason of the infringement of one or more claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 10,312,335; 8,350,294; 8,404,508; and 9,748,347. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation named as respondents Innoscience (Zhuhai) Technology, Company, Ltd., of Zhuhai, Guangdong, China; and Innoscience America, Inc. of Santa Clara, California. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On July 2, 2024, the CALJ issued the subject ID, Order No. 22 (corrected ID was issued on July 15, 2024), extending the target date for completion of the investigation from November

4, 2024, to November 5, 2024. The ID explained that good cause for the extension exists due to the complexity of the issues raised in the investigation and current constraints on judicial resources. The subject ID stated that the final ID shall issue no later than July 5, 2024, on which date the final ID issued. No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, the target date is November 5, 2024.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on July 25, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
