NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION WITH RESPECT TO SIX PATENT CLAIMS

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 13) issued by the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ"), terminating the investigation with respect to claims 2, 3, and 4 of U.S. Patent No. 8,063,577 ("the '577 patent") and claims 4, 6, and 7 of U.S. Patent No. 8,070,328 ("the '328 patent") based on the complainant's withdrawal of the complaint as to those claims.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on August 18, 2023, based on a complaint filed by Signify North America Corporation of Bridgewater, New Jersey, and Signify Holding B.V. of the Netherlands (together, "Signify"). 88 FR 56661-62 (Aug. 18, 2023). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of certain LED lighting devices, LED power supplies, components thereof, and products containing same by reason of infringement of claims 1-4, 6, and 7 of the '577 patent; claim 1 of U.S. Patent No. 9,119,268

("the '268 patent"); and claims 1, 4-7, 9, 10, 14, and 15 of the '328 patent. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named as respondents Current Lighting Solutions, LLC of Beachwood, Ohio. *Id.* at 56662. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations ("OUII") is participating in the investigation. *Id.*

The Commission previously terminated the investigation with respect to the '268 patent. Order No. 8 (Dec. 1, 2023), *not reviewed by* Comm'n Notice (Jan. 2, 2024).

On January 19, 2024, Signify filed a motion to terminate the investigation with respect to claims 2, 3, and 4 of the '577 patent and claims 4, 6, and 7 of the '328 patent based on the withdrawal of the complaint as to those claims. The motion indicates that Signify continues to assert claims 1, 6, and 7 of the '577 patent and claims 1, 5, 9, 10, 14, and 15 of the '328 patent. On January 23, 2024, OUII filed a response in support of the motion.

On January 23, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID pursuant to Commission Rule 210.21(a) (19 CFR 210.21(a)), granting the motion. The ID finds no extraordinary circumstances that would warrant denying the motion. No party petitioned for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Claims 2, 3, and 4 of the '577 patent and claims 4, 6, and 7 of the '328 patent are hereby terminated from this investigation.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on February 15, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
