NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission ("Commission") has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 64) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ"), extending the target date to October 20, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on December 6, 2023, based on a complaint filed by Samsung Display Company, Ltd. of the Republic of Korea. 88 FR 84829 (Dec. 6, 2023). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of Section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), in the importation into the United States, or in the sale of certain organic light-emitting diode display modules and components thereof by reason of misappropriation of trade secrets, the threat or effect of which is to destroy or substantially injure a domestic industry or to prevent the establishment of an industry in the United States. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named as respondents BOE Technology Group Co., Ltd. of Beijing, China; Mianyang BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Mianyang, China; Chengdu BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Chengdu, China; Chongqing BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Chongqing, China; Wuhan BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Wuhan, China;

BMOT f/k/a Kunming BOE Display Technology of Yunnan Dianzhong New Area, China; and BOE Technology America Inc. of Santa Clara, California. *Id*. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is participating in the investigation. *Id*.

The ALJ has previously extended the target date several times. *See* Order No. 59 (Jan. 29, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (Feb. 24, 2025); Order No. 61 (Mar. 20, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (Apr. 18, 2025); Order No. 62 (May 1, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (May 20, 2025).

On May 30, 2025, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 64) to extend the target date from September 30, 2025, to October 20, 2025. The ID states that the extension is "due to the workload on other pending investigations and other issues which are still being resolved in this Investigation." ID at 1.

No petitions for Commission review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, the target date is now October 20, 2025, and the final ID is due by June 19, 2025.

No further extensions of the date for issuance of the final ID are anticipated.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 10, 2025.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
