NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION TO AFFIRM AN INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE AND NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION REVISING THE TARGET DATE EXTENSION INITIAL DETERMINATION

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission ("Commission") has determined to affirm an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 67) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ"), extending the target date to November 17, 2025, and not to review an ID (Order No. 69) revising Order No. 67.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on December 6, 2023, based on a complaint filed by Samsung Display Company, Ltd. of the Republic of Korea. 88 FR 84829 (Dec. 6, 2023). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), in the importation into the United States, or in the sale of certain organic light-emitting diode display modules and components thereof by reason of misappropriation of trade secrets, the threat or effect of which is to destroy or substantially injure a domestic industry or to prevent the establishment of an industry in the United States. *Id.* The Commission's notice of investigation named as respondents BOE Technology Group Co., Ltd. of Beijing, China; Mianyang BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Mianyang, China; Ordos Yuansheng Optoelectronics

Co., Ltd. of Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region, China; Chengdu BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Chengdu, China; Chongqing BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Chongqing, China; Wuhan BOE Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. of Wuhan, China; BMOT f/k/a Kunming BOE Display Technology ("BMOT") of Yunnan Dianzhong New Area, China; and BOE Technology America Inc. of Santa Clara, California. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is participating in the investigation. *Id.*

On June 17, 2025, the Commission amended the complaint and notice of investigation to change the name of respondent BMOT to Yunnan Invensight Optoelectronics Technology Co., Ltd. Order No. 63 (May 27, 2025); *unreviewed by* Notice (June 17, 2025).

The ALJ previously extended the target date several times. *See* Order No. 59 (Jan. 29, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (Feb. 24, 2025); Order No. 61 (Mar. 20, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (Apr. 18, 2025); Order No. 62 (May 1, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (May 20, 2025); Order No. 64 (May 30, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (June 17, 2025); Order No. 66 (June 18, 2025), *unreviewed by* Notice (June 26, 2025). The Commission's notices of non-review of Order Nos. 64 and 66 stated: "No further extensions of the date for issuance for the final ID are anticipated." Notices at 2.

On July 2, 2025, the ALJ issued Order No. 67, an ID extending the target date from November 3, 2025, to November 17, 2025, and the deadline for the final ID to July 17, 2025. Order No. 67 at 1. No petitions for review of that ID were filed.

Pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a), a target date may be extended for "good cause." 19 CFR 210.51(a). Order No. 67 stated that the current target date extension is "due to the workload on other pending investigations and other issues which are still being resolved in this Investigation." ID at 1.

On July 8, 2025, and in view of the language concerning no further extensions in the Commission's notices concerning Order Nos. 64 and 66, the Commission determined pursuant to Commission Rule 210.44, 19 CFR 210.44, to review Order No. 67 *sua sponte*, and, on review, to remand the ID to the ALJ to issue no later than July 11, 2025, a revised ID providing a more detailed justification to satisfy the "good cause" requirement of Rule 210.51(a) under these circumstances.

On July 11, 2025, the ALJ issued both a final ID on violation and Order No. 69, which revises Order No. 67 in response to the Commission's July 8, 2025 notice. Order No. 69 explains:

I recognize that the FID in this Investigation has taken an extraordinary amount of time to complete. In addition to the reasons stated in Order No. 67, my intention has been to ensure that every contested issue presented by each party was thoroughly deliberated and given the appropriate attention given the rich factual record. Moreover, the extension I requested in Order No. 67 was not only to allow

time to finalize the FID but also to address all pre-hearing issues and prepare for the evidentiary hearing in Inv. No. 337-TA-1413, which commenced on July 9, 2025, and is scheduled to end on July 16, 2025.

Order No. 69 at 1.

In view of the explanation in Order No. 69 and the issuance of the final ID, the Commission has determined to affirm Order No. 67, and not to review Order No. 69. Accordingly, the target date for completion of the investigation is November 17, 2025.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on July 30, 2025.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
