NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION GRANTING A MOTION FOR PARTIAL TERMINATION OF THE INVESTIGATION WITH RESPECT TO AN ASSERTED PATENT CLAIM

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 19) granting an unopposed motion for partial termination of the investigation with respect to an asserted patent claim.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on December 6, 2023, based on a complaint filed on behalf of Nokia Technologies Oy of Finland and Nokia Corporation of Finland (collectively, "Nokia"). 88 FR 84830 (Dec. 6, 2023). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of certain video capable electronic devices, including computers, streaming devices, televisions, and components and modules thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 7,724,818 ("the '818 patent"); 10,536,714; 11,805,267; 8,077,991; and 8,050,321. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that an industry in the United States exists as required by the applicable Federal Statute. *Id.* The Commission's

notice of investigation names HP, Inc. of Palo Alto, CA; Amazon.com, Inc. of Seattle, WA; and Amazon.com Services, LLC of Seattle, WA as respondents. *Id.* at 84831. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is also a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On February 13, 2024, Complainant Nokia moved to terminate asserted claim 23 of the '818 patent from the investigation by reason of withdrawal under Commission Rule 210.21(a), 19 CFR 210.21(a). No party opposed the motion.

On February 14, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 19) granting the unopposed motion for partial termination of the investigation with respect to asserted claim 23 of the '818 patent. The ID finds Nokia's motion complies with the Commission's Rules and "no extraordinary circumstances exist that would prevent the requested partial termination." ID at 2. No petitions for review were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Claim 23 of the '818 patent is hereby terminated from the investigation.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on March 8, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 CFR Part 210.
