NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE INVESTIGATION AS TO CERTAIN PATENT CLAIMS BASED ON PARTIAL WITHDRAWAL OF THE COMPLAINT

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission ("Commission") has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 14) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") granting complainant's unopposed motion to terminate the above-captioned investigation as to claims 4, 9, 14, and 19 of U.S. Patent No. 11,184,130 ("the '130 patent") based on partial withdrawal of the complaint.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on January 25, 2024, based on a complaint filed by Motorola Mobility LLC ("Complainant") of Chicago, Illinois. 89 FR 4993 (Jan. 25, 2024). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, or the sale within the United States after importation of certain cellular base station communication equipment, components thereof, and products containing same by reason of infringement of one or more of claims 11 and 14-20 of the '130 patent; claims 11-20 of U.S. Patent No. 11,601,896; claims 1-10 and 12-15 of U.S. Patent No. 11,284,466; and claims 12-19 of U.S. Patent No. 10,869,234. *Id*.

The Commission's notice of investigation named as respondents Ericsson AB of Stockholm, Sweden; Telefonaktiebolaget LM Ericsson of Stockholm, Sweden; and Ericsson Inc. of Plano, Texas. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On June 4, 2024, Complainant filed an unopposed motion to terminate the investigation as to claims 4, 9, 14, and 19 of the '130 patent. Claims 4 and 9 were only asserted for purposes of meeting the domestic industry requirement. No responses to the unopposed motion were filed.

On June 5, 2024, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 14), granting Complainant's unopposed motion to terminate the investigation as to the specified claims of the '130 patent. The subject ID finds that Complainant meets the requirements of Commission Rule 210.21(a) (19 CFR 210.21(a)), and that there are no extraordinary circumstances that would prevent the requested partial termination of the investigation.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The following claims are hereby terminated from the investigation; claims 4, 9, 14, and 19 of the '130 patent.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 28, 2024.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
