NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission ("Commission") has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 58) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ"), extending the target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation to January 8, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On March 18, 2024, the Commission instituted this investigation based on a complaint filed by Samsara Inc. of San Francisco, California. 89 FR 19356 (Mar. 18, 2024). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain vehicle telematics, fleet management, and video-based safety systems, devices, and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 11,190,373; 11,127,130; and 11,611,621. The Commission's notice of investigation named Motive Technologies Inc. of San Francisco, California as the respondent. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On July 22, 2025, the ALJ issued the subject ID extending the target date for completion of the investigation from November 25, 2025, to January 8, 2026. Order No. 58 (July 22, 2025). The ID explains that extending the target date will give the ALJ "adequate time to prepare the final initial determination while attending to . . . responsibilities in other investigations." ID at 1.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, the target date is now January 8, 2026, and the final ID is due by September 8, 2025.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 14, 2025.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
