**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION EXTENDING THE TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 31) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) extending the target date for completion of this investigation to December 7, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 23, 2025, based on a complaint filed by Estelgia, LLC (“Estelgia”) of Dover, Delaware. 90 FR 26608-09 (June 23, 2025). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain Wi-Fi routers, Wi-Fi devices, mesh Wi-Fi network devices and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent No. 7,936,714 (“the ’714 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 11,246,016 (“the ’016 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 10,735,973 (“the ’973 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 10,531,518 (“the ’518 patent”); U.S. Patent No. 9,775,164 (“the ’164 patent”); and U.S. Patent No. 9,277,591 (“the ’591 patent”). *Id.* at 26608. The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.*

The notice of investigation names 7 respondents: (1) ASUSTek Computer Inc. of Taipei City, Taiwan; (2) ASUS Computer International of Fremont, California; (3) D-Link Corporation of Taipei, Taiwan and (4) D-Link Systems, Inc. of Irvine, California (collectively, “D-Link Respondents”); (5) Linksys Holdings, Inc. of Irvine, California and (6) Linksys USA, Inc. of Irvine, California

(collectively, “Linksys Respondents”); and (7) Plume Design Inc. of Palo Alto, California. *Id.* at 26609. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is also named as a party to this investigation. *Id.*

On December 19, 2025, the Commission terminated the Linksys Respondents from the investigation based on a settlement agreement. *See* Order No. 12 (Nov. 25, 2025), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Dec. 19, 2025).

On January 29, 2026, the Commission terminated claim 14 of the ’714 patent; claims 1-5, 7-17, and 20 of the ’016 patent; claims 2, 3, 5-7, 10, and 13 of the ’973 patent; claims 12 and 13 of the ’518 patent; claims 2, 4, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13-15, 17-21, 23, 25, 27, 28, and 30-33 of the ’164 patent; and claims 1, 2, 5, 9, 10, 12, and 14-20 of the ’591 patent from the investigation based on the withdrawal of allegations by Estelgia. *See* Order No. 17 (Jan. 6, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Jan. 29, 2026).

On March 17, 2026, the Commission terminated the ’016, the ’518, the ’164, and the ’591 patents from the investigation based on the withdrawal of allegations by Estelgia. *See* Order No. 20 (Feb. 19, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Mar. 17, 2026).

On April 27, 2026, the Commission terminated the D-Link Respondents from the investigation based on a consent order. *See* Order No. 30 (Mar. 26, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Apr. 27, 2026).

On July 23, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 31), pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a), 19 CFR 210.51(a), extending the target date for completion of the present investigation to December 7, 2026. The ID notes that the final ID will issue by August 6, 2026.

No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, the target date for completion of the investigation is extended to December 7, 2026.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 24, 2026.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
