**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW
AN INITIAL DETERMINATION AMENDING THE TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 19) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting an amended target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation of July 2, 2027.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On November 28, 2025, the Commission instituted this investigation under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on a complaint filed by BH Innovations LLC of New York, New York, as amended to add additional complainants Longitude Licensing Limited and 138 East LCD Advancements Ltd., both of Dublin, Ireland. *See* 90 FR 54742-43 (Nov. 28, 2025). The complaint, as amended and supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain liquid crystal display devices, components thereof, and products containing the same by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 7,705,948 and 7,570,334. *Id.* The complaint also alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The notice of investigation names twenty respondents, including: HKC Corporation Ltd. of

Shenzhen City, China; Chongqing HKC Optoelectronics, Technology Co., Ltd. of Jieshi, China; HKC Overseas Ltd. of Hong Kong; HiSense Co., Ltd., HiSense International Co., Ltd., and HiSense Visual Technology Co. Ltd. all of Qingdao, China; HiSense US Corporation of Suwanee, Georgia; VIZIO Holding Corp. of Irvine, California; TCL Electronics Holdings Ltd. of Hong Kong; Shenzhen TCL New Technology Co. Ltd. of Shenzhen, China; TCL King Electrical Appliances Co. Ltd. of Huizhou, China; TTE Technology Inc. of Irvine, California; TCL Technology Group Corp. of Huizhou City, China; TCL Moka International Ltd. of Hong Kong; TCL Overseas Marketing Ltd. of Hong Kong; TCL Industries Holdings Co., Ltd. of Shenzhen, China; TCL Smart Device (Vietnam) Co. Ltd., of Tan Binh Town, Vietnam; LG Electronics, Inc. of Seoul, Republic of Korea; LG Electronics USA, Inc. of Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey; and Westinghouse Electric Corporation of Canonsburg, Pennsylvania (collectively “Respondents”). *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not named as a party. *Id.*

On December 17, 2025, the Commission determined not to review an initial determination (Order No. 3) setting an 18-month target date for completion of the investigation of May 28, 2027. *See* Order No. 3 (Dec. 5, 2025), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Dec. 17, 2025).

On April 15, 2025, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 19) setting an amended target date for completion of the investigation of July 2, 2026. Order No. 19 (Apr. 15, 2025). The ID explains that the target date is amended is necessary due to the status of discovery. Pursuant to this schedule, the final initial determination on violation will be due no later than March 2, 2027. No party petitioned for review of the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID (Order No. 19).

Accordingly, the target date for completion of the investigation is July 2, 2027, and the final initial determination is due no later than March 2, 2027.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on May 4, 2026.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
