**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO  
REVIEW INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING TARGET DATE**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 4) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting the target date for completion of this investigation as August 9, 2027.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** On January 8, 2026, the Commission instituted this investigation under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on a complaint filed on behalf of T&R Chemicals, Inc. of Clint, Texas. 91 FR 720 (Jan. 8, 2026). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 in the importation into the United States and sale of certain glycerol esters of rosin and packaging by reason of unfair competition through false advertising and tortious interference, the threat or effect of which is to destroy or substantially injure an industry in the United States or to prevent the establishment of an industry in the United States. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation (“NOI”) named the following entities as respondents: Caragum International of Le Rove, France and Kemi Pine Rosins Portugal S.A. of Cantanhede, Portugal. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations was also named as a party in this investigation. *Id.*

On January 27, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 4), pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a) (19 CFR 210.51(a)), setting the target date for completion of this

investigation as August 9, 2027, which is nineteen months from the date that the NOI was published in the *Federal Register*. The ID explains, “[s]etting a 19-month target date will provide me with adequate time to draft the initial determination for this investigation, while also attending to my responsibilities in other investigations.” ID at 1. Under this schedule, the final ID on violation is due April 8, 2027.

No petition for review of the subject ID was filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for this investigation is August 9, 2027.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on February 24, 2026.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
