**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN
INITIAL DETERMINATION GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR PARTIAL
TERMINATION BY WITHDRAWAL OF CERTAIN PATENT CLAIMS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 12) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) in the above-captioned investigation granting an unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation based on withdrawal of certain patent claims.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: On January 16, 2026, the Commission instituted this investigation under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on a complaint filed by Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. of Korea and Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Englewood, New Jersey (collectively “Complainants”). 91 FR 2153-54 (Jan. 16, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleged violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain wearable devices by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 10,642,359 (“the ’359 patent”); 10,945,677 (“the ’677 patent”); 10,231,675 (“the ’675 patent”); and 10,978,789 (“the ’789 patent”). *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation named the following entities as respondents: Ouraring, Inc. of San Francisco, CA and Ōura Health Oy of Finland (collectively “Respondents”). *Id.*

On July 28, 2026, Complainants filed an unopposed motion to terminate the investigation with respect to the following patent claims based on withdrawal of the complaint as to those

claims: claims 2, 7, 8, 10, 14, 15, and 20 of the '359 patent; claims 4-7, 10-14, and 16-20 of the '677 Patent; claims 14 and 16-20 of the '675 Patent; and claims 8 and 10 of the '789 patent (collectively, the "Withdrawn Claims"). ID at 1.

On July 29, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 12) pursuant to Commission Rule 210.21(a) (19 CFR 210.21(a)), granting Complainants' unopposed motion to partially terminate the investigation with respect to the Withdrawn Claims. Order 12 at 2 (July 29, 2026). The ID finds that "there are no extraordinary circumstances exist that would prevent the requested partial termination of this Investigation." *Id.*

No petition for review of the subject ID was filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The following patent claims are terminated from the investigation: claims 2, 7, 8, 10, 14, 15, and 20 of the '359 patent; claims 4-7, 10-14, and 16-20 of the '677 Patent; claims 14 and 16-20 of the '675 Patent; and claims 8 and 10 of the '789 patent.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 26, 2026.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
