**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION TERMINATING THE
INVESTIGATION AS TO CERTAIN RESPONDENTS BASED ON CONSENT ORDERS**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 15) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”), terminating the investigation as to respondents Medsal International of Sialkot, Pakistan (“Medsal”) and Research Corporation d/b/a Research Industries of Sialkot, Pakistan (“Research Corporation”) based on consent orders.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on January 20, 2026, based upon a complaint filed on behalf of Huwais IP Holding LLC of Jackson, Michigan and Versah, LLC of Jackson, Michigan (together, “Complainants”). 91 FR 2,366-67 (Jan. 20, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain dental burs and kits thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,326,778 and 11,712,250 and U.S. Trademark Registration Nos. 6,261,888; 6,261,886; and 4,689,471. *Id.* The complaint also alleges that a domestic industry exists pursuant to subsection (a)(2) of section 337. *Id.* The notice of investigation named the following respondents: (1) Pawn Move of Sialkot, Pakistan; (2) Raheela Instruments of Dubai Transit, United Arab

Emirates; (3) Ali House of Dental of Sialkot, Pakistan; (4) Dental68 of Grapevine, Texas (“Dental68”); (5) Mahfooz Instruments of Sialkot, Pakistan; (6) Medsal International of Sialkot, Pakistan (“Medsal”); (7) Hamsan International d/b/a Hamsan Surgical of Sialkot, Pakistan; (8) Arck Instruments UK LTD of Gillingham, United Kingdom (“Arck Instruments”); (9) Beijing Jiaxin Shenghe Technology Co., Ltd. of Cucamonga, California (“Denshine”); (10) DentalBTC of Sialkot, Pakistan; (11) iDentalShop of Grove Village, Illinois; (12) Dyna International of Lahore, Pakistan; (13) Merit Surgical of Ontario, Canada; (14) Skeema Dental Italia of Modena, Italy (“Skeema”); (15) Orthodonticdental d/b/a Orthodont of Perth, Australia (“Orthodonticdental”); and (16) New Med Instruments of Sialkot, Pakistan. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations (“OUII”) is participating in this investigation. *Id.*

On March 25, 2026, the Commission amended the complaint and notice of investigation to add as a respondent Research Corporation d/b/a Research Industries of Sialkot, Pakistan (“Research Corporation”). Order No. 6 (Mar. 3, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Mar. 25, 2026).

On April 7, 2026, the Commission terminated the following respondents from the investigation based on a consent order: (1) Ali House of Dental, (2) Merit Surgical, (3) New Med Instruments, (4) Pawn Move, (5) Raheela Instruments, (6) Dyna International, and (7) Mahfooz Instruments. Order No. 7 (Mar. 13, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Apr. 7, 2026). Also on April 7, 2026, the Commission terminated respondent Denshine from the investigation based on a settlement agreement. Order No. 8 (Mar. 18, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (Apr. 7, 2026).

On July 1, 2026, the Commission found respondents Dental68 and Skeema in default. Order No. 10 (June 10, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (July 1, 2026). Also on July 1, 2026, the Commission terminated respondents Arck Instruments, DentalBTC, iDentalShop, and Orthodonticdental from the investigation based on withdrawal of the complaint. Order No. 14 (June 17, 2026), *unreviewed by* Comm’n Notice (July 1, 2026).

On June 12, 2026, Complainants filed a renewed motion to terminate respondents Medsal and Research Corporation from the investigation based on a consent order stipulation and proposed consent order, correcting certain discrepancies in the original motion filed on May 26, 2026. On June 5, 2026, OUII responded to the original motion, indicating it would not oppose the requested relief after correcting certain discrepancies. No other party responded to Complainants’ motion.

On July 13, 2026, the presiding ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 15) terminating Medsal and Research Corporation from the investigation based on consent orders. Order No. 15 confirms that the consent order stipulations and proposed consent orders satisfy the requirements of Commission Rules 210.2(c)(3) and (c)(4) (19 CFR 210.21(c)(3), (c)(4)) and finds that terminating Medsal and Research Corporation would not be contrary to the public interest. No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, respondents Medsal and Research Corporation are terminated from the investigation. The Commission has issued consent orders to Medsal and Research Corporation.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 12, 2026.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
