**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION SETTING A 17-MONTH TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 5) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting a 17-month target date of July 6, 2027, for completion of the above-captioned investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on February 2, 2026, based on a complaint filed by MolecuLight Inc. of Canada and MolecuLight Corp. of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. 91 FR 4629-30 (Feb. 2, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain medical imaging devices by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent No. 10,438,356 *Id.* at 4629. The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The notice of investigation names two respondents: (1) Kent Imaging Inc. of Calgary, Alberta, Canada; and (2) Aduvo Diagnostics Pvt. Ltd. of Chennai, India. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is also named as a party to this investigation. *Id.*


On February 25, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID setting a 17-month target date of July 6, 2027, for completion of the investigation. The subject ID states that the final ID is due no later than March 5, 2027. No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for completion of the investigation is July 6, 2027.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on March 20, 2026.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
