**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN
INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING A 19-MONTH TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 5) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”), setting a 19-month target date of September 20, 2027, for completion of this investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on February 17, 2026, based on a complaint filed by Vicor Corporation of Andover, Massachusetts (“Vicor”). 91 FR 7301-02 (Feb. 17, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, in the importation into the United States, sale for importation, or sale within the United States after importation of certain power converters, circuit board assemblies, and computing systems containing the same by reason of infringement of one or more of asserted claims 1-20, 24, 25, 28-39, 41-50, 60-63, 66, 68-74, 76, 77, 80-85, 87-90, and 94 of U.S Patent No. 12,395,087. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation names the following respondents: Delta Electronics, Inc. of Taipei, Taiwan; Delta Electronics (Americas) Ltd. of Fremont, California; DET Logistics (USA) Corporation of Fremont, California; Luxshare Precision Industry Co., Ltd. of Dongguan, China; Dongguan Luxshare Technology Co., Ltd. a/k/a Luxshare-Tech of Dongguan City, China; Shanghai Peiyuan Electronics Co., Ltd. d/b/a

MetaPWR Electronics Co., Ltd. of Lingang New Area, China; Shanghai MetaPWR Electronics Co., Ltd. of Lingang New Area, China; Monolithic Power Systems, Inc. of Kirkland, Washington; Chengdu Monolithic Power Systems Co., Ltd. of Chengdu, China; MPS International (Shanghai) Ltd. of Shanghai, China; Wistron Corporation of Taipei City, Taiwan; Wiwynn Corporation of New Taipei City, Taiwan; Quanta Computer Inc. of Taoyuan City, Taiwan; Quanta Cloud Technology Inc. of Taoyuan City, Taiwan; Quanta Cloud Technology USA, LLC of San Jose, California; and Quanta Computer USA Inc. of Fremont, California. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not participating in this investigation. *Id.*

On March 3, 2026, the presiding ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 5) setting a 19-month target date of September 20, 2027, for completion of this investigation. The ID states that the deadline for issuing the final ID (“FID”) on violation is May 20, 2027.

No party filed a petition to review the subject ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. Accordingly, the target date for completion of this investigation is September 20, 2027. The deadline for issuing the FID on violation is May 20, 2027.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on March 24, 2026.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
