**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION SETTING A 19-MONTH TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 5) of the presiding chief administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting a 19-month target date of November 30, 2027, for completion of the above-captioned investigation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on April 30, 2026, based on a complaint filed by GlobalFoundries U.S. Inc. of Malta, New York. 91 FR 23305-06 (Apr. 30, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain semiconductor devices, products containing same, and components thereof, by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 8,330,235; 8,507,983; 9,093,425; 9,865,546; 10,062,748; and 10,707,167. *Id.* at 23305. The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The notice of investigation names eight respondents: (1) Tower Semiconductor Ltd. of Migdal Haemek, Israel; (2) Tower Partners Semiconductor Co., Ltd. of Toyama, Japan; (3) Tower Semiconductor Italy S.R.L. (Italy) of Milano, Italy; (4) Tower US

Holdings, Inc. of Newport Beach, California; (5) Tower Semiconductor San Antonio, Inc. of San Antonio, Texas; (6) Tower NPB Holdings, Inc. of San Jose, California; (7) Tower Semiconductor Newport Beach, Inc. of Newport Beach, California; and (8) Newport Fab LLC of Newport Beach, California. *Id.* at 23306. The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not named as a party to this investigation. *Id.*

On May 27, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID setting a 19-month target date of November 30, 2027, for completion of the investigation. The subject ID states that the final ID is due no later than July 30, 2027. No petitions for review of the subject ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for completion of the investigation is November 30, 2027.

The Commission vote for this determination took place on June 24, 2026.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
