**NOTICE OF COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL
DETERMINATION SETTING A 19-MONTH TARGET DATE**

AGENCY: U.S. International Trade Commission.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 6) of the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting a 19-month target date for completion of the above-captioned investigation of January 31, 2028.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 30, 2026, based on a complaint filed by Caterpillar Inc of Irving, Texas. 91 FR 39633 (June 30, 2026). The complaint, as supplemented, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337, based on the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain heavy machinery and components thereof by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 8,515,637; 9,133,837; 9,347,554; and 10,059,341. *Id.* The complaint further alleges that a domestic industry exists. *Id.* The notice of investigation names as respondents Doosan Bobcat Inc. of Seongnam-si, Republic of Korea; Doosan Bobcat North America, Inc. of West Fargo, North Dakota; Doosan Bobcat Mexico Monterrey, S. de R.L. de C.V. of Nuevo León, Mexico; Doosan Bobcat EMEA S.R.O. of Dobříš, Czech Republic; Doosan Bobcat France S.A.S. of Pontchâteau, France; and Doosan Bobcat India Private Ltd. of Chennai, India. *Id.* The Office of Unfair Import Investigations is not participating in this investigation. *Id.*

On July 22, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 6) setting a 19-month target date of January 31, 2028, for completion of the investigation pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a), 19 CFR 210.51(a). The ID states that any final initial determination is due no later than September 30, 2027.

No petitions for review of the ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID. The investigation's target date is January 31, 2028.¹

The Commission vote for this determination took place on August 21, 2026.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
