**NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO  
REVIEW INITIAL DETERMINATION SETTING TARGET DATE**

**AGENCY:** U.S. International Trade Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission (“Commission”) has determined not to review an initial determination (“ID”) (Order No. 4) issued by the presiding administrative law judge (“ALJ”) setting the target date for completion of this investigation as January 13, 2028.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** On July 16, 2026, the Commission instituted this investigation under section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. 1337 (“section 337”), based on a complaint filed on behalf of Kids2, LLC of Atlanta, Georgia (“Complainant”). 91 FR 43,663-64 (July 16, 2026). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 based upon the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain convertible child highchairs by reason of the infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 9,101,225; 9,883,749; 10,278,513; 10,835,053; and 11,534,006. *Id.* The Commission’s notice of investigation (“NOI”) named the following entities as respondents: Graco Children’s Products Inc. of Atlanta, Georgia; Newell Brands Distribution LLC of Newville, Pennsylvania; Newell Brands Inc. of Atlanta, Georgia; Newell Brands Canada ULC of Bolton, Canada; and Baby Trend, Inc. of Fontana, California. *Id.*

On August 4, 2026, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 4), pursuant to Commission Rule 210.51(a) (19 CFR 210.51(a)), setting the target date for completion of this investigation as

January 13, 2028, which is approximately eighteen months from the date that the NOI was published in the *Federal Register*. ID at 2. The ID explains that this target date is necessary “in view of the procedural schedule for other investigations already instituted.” *Id.* Under this schedule, the final ID on violation is due September 13, 2027. *Id.*

No petition for review of the subject ID was filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID. The target date for this investigation is January 13, 2028.<sup>1</sup>

The Commission vote for this determination took place on September 1, 2026.

The authority for the Commission’s determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR Part 210).
