**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 114), extending the target date for completion of this investigation from September 10, 2014 to October 14, 2014.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The Commission instituted this investigation on February 5, 2013, based on a complaint filed by InterDigital Communications, Inc. of King of Prussia, Pennsylvania, as well as InterDigital Technology Corporation, IPR Licensing, Inc., and InterDigital Holdings, Inc., each of Wilmington, Delaware (collectively, "InterDigital"). 78 *Fed. Reg.* 8191 (Feb. 5, 2013). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by reason of the infringement of 100 claims from seven United States Patents. The notice of institution named ten respondents.

On April 18, 2014, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 114), extending the target date from September 10, 2013 to October 14, 2014. The ID explained that good cause exists for a short extension because of several factors including various motions by the parties to strike portions of the post-hearing briefs. ID at 3; see 19 C.F.R. § 210.51(a).

No petitions for review were filed. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in Part 210 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. Part 210).
