Boltless Steel Shelving Units Prepackaged for Sale from China

DETERMINATIONS

On the basis of the record¹ developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the antidumping and countervailing duty orders on boltless steel shelving units prepackaged for sale from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.²

BACKGROUND

The Commission instituted these reviews on April 1, 2026 (91 FR 16234) and determined on July 6, 2026, that it would conduct expedited reviews (91 FR 52082, August 12, 2026).

The Commission made these determinations pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determinations in these reviews on September 24, 2026. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 5793 (September 2026), entitled *Boltless Steel Shelving Units Prepackaged for Sale from China: Investigation Nos. 701-TA-523 and 731-TA-1259 (Second Review)*.
