**Corrosion Inhibitors from China**

**DETERMINATIONS**

On the basis of the record<sup>1</sup> developed in the subject five-year reviews, the United States International Trade Commission (“Commission”) determines, pursuant to the Tariff Act of 1930 (“the Act”), that revocation of the antidumping and countervailing duty orders on corrosion inhibitors from China would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.

**BACKGROUND**

The Commission instituted these reviews on February 2, 2026 (91 FR 4617), and determined on May 8, 2026, that it would conduct expedited reviews (91 FR 35267, June 10, 2026).

The Commission made these determinations pursuant to section 751(c) of the Act (19 U.S.C. 1675(c)). It completed and filed its determinations in these reviews on July 30, 2026. The views of the Commission are contained in USITC Publication 5769 (July 2026), entitled *Corrosion Inhibitors from China: Investigation Nos. 701-TA-638 and 731-TA-1473 (Review)*.
