SUMMARY: The Commission instituted the subject five-year review in March 1, 2021 (86 FR 12030) to determine whether revocation of the antidumping duty order on pressure sensitive plastic tape from Italy would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury. On June 7, 2021, the Department of Commerce published notice that it was revoking the order effective April 14, 2021, because no domestic interested party filed a timely notice of intent to participate (86 FR 30253). Accordingly, the subject review is terminated.
