11	Chairman. As observers of the Senate know, yesterday
12	Senator Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia became the
13	longest serving U.S. Senator at 17,327 days.
14	As observers of the Commission will note, on
15	Friday, June 16, Chairman Koplan's second term as
16	Chairman will end. While he's not the longest serving
17	Commissioner in fact, that goes to Commissioner
18	Brossard, a Republican from Idaho I would note who
19	served for almost 34 years as a Commissioner before
20	the rules were changed and as a Chairman for seven of
21	those years I would note that in looking at the
22	records from the Secretary's office, when the gavel
23	falls today, Steve Koplan will have chaired 150 votes
24	and 135 hearings.
25	While this morning I couldn't verify whether

- 2 neither Ask.com, Google, nor EDIS would provide that
- answer, I do think that it might be a modern day
- 4 record, and so I would like to take this moment to
- 5 congratulate Chairman Koplan on his years of service

- 20 both Presidents Clinton and Bush have entrusted the
- 21 position of Chairman to me, and for that, I am deeply
- 22 honored.
- I also want to acknowledge the fact that I
- 24 have been blessed with incredible personal staff ever
- 25 since I've been with this agency. Today that consists
