GENERAL INFORMATION

Background.--On May 30, 2008, the Department of Commerce issued an antidumping duty order on imports of light-walled rectangular pipe and tube from Turkey (73 FR 31065). On August 5, 2008, the Department of Commerce issued a countervailing duty order on imports of light-walled rectangular pipe and tube from China (73 FR 45405) and antidumping duty orders on imports of light-walled rectangular pipe and tube from China, Korea, and Mexico (73 FR 45403). On April 1, 2013, the Commission instituted reviews pursuant to section 751(c) of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1675(c)) (the Act) to determine whether determine whether revocation of the countervailing duty order on light-walled rectangular pipe and tube from China and the antidumping duty orders on light-walled rectangular pipe and tube from China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury within a reasonably foreseeable time (78 FR 19526). If Commerce and the Commission make affirmative determinations, the orders will remain in place. If either agency makes negative determinations, Commerce will revoke the order.

<u>Due date of questionnaire(s)</u>.-- Please submit the completed questionnaire(s) to the United States International Trade Commission so as to be received by no later than <u>February 7, 2014</u>. Because Commission staff might contact you with questions during the course of the proceeding, save the final version of the document(s) and retain all files and worksheets associated with the completed questionnaire(s). Please also retain a copy of any paper original document that you submit.

<u>Service of questionnaire response(s)</u>.--In the event that your firm is a party to this proceeding, you are required to serve a copy of the questionnaire(s), once completed, on parties to the proceeding that are subject to administrative protective order (see 19 CFR § 207.7). A list of such parties is maintained by the Commission's Secretary and may be obtained by calling 202-205-1803. A certificate of service must accompany the copy of the completed questionnaire(s) you submit (see 19 CFR § 207.7).

<u>Confidentiality</u>.--The commercial and financial data furnished in response to the enclosed questionnaire(s) that reveal the individual operations of your firm will be treated as confidential by the Commission to the extent that such data are not otherwise available to the public and will not be disclosed except as may be required by law (see 19 U.S.C. § 1677f). Such confidential information will not be published in a manner that will reveal the individual operations of your firm; however, general characterizations of numerical business proprietary information (such as discussion of trends) will be treated as confidential business information only at the request of the submitter for good cause shown.

<u>Verification.</u>--The information submitted in the enclosed questionnaire(s) is subject to audit and verification by the Commission. To facilitate possible verification of data, please keep all your files, worksheets, and supporting documents used in the preparation of the questionnaire response(s).

Release of information.--The information provided by your firm in response to the questionnaire(s), as well as any other business proprietary information submitted by your firm to the Commission in connection with the proceeding, may become subject to, and released under, the administrative protective order provisions of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1677f) and section 207.7 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 CFR § 207.7). This means that certain lawyers and other authorized individuals may temporarily be given access to the information for use in connection with this proceeding or other import-injury proceedings conducted by the Commission on the same or similar merchandise; those individuals would be subject to severe penalties if the information were divulged to unauthorized individuals.

<u>Answer all questions</u>.-- Do not leave any question or section blank unless a questionnaire expressly directs you to skip over certain questions or sections. If your firm is completing more than one questionnaire in connection with this proceeding (i.e., a producer, importer, purchaser, and/or foreign producer questionnaire), you need not respond to duplicated questions in the questionnaires.

<u>Consolidate all establishments in each subject country</u>.--Report the requested data for your establishment(s) located in each of the four subject countries (China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey). Firms operating more than one establishment should combine the data for all establishments into a single report.

<u>Electronic completion.</u>—Please electronically enter your responses into the Commission provided MS Word document. <u>Electronic submission.</u>-- Responding firms should submit their questionnaire responses electronically in MS Word format. The submission of questionnaire responses in the MS Word format allows the Commission to electronically extract data from questionnaires and thus, compile, assess, and analyze submitted data more efficiently and promptly. Furthermore, the electronic submission of questionnaires completed in MS Word facilitates the Commission's ability to produce

DEFINITIONS

Product.— Light-walled rectangular pipe and tube (LWRPT) is certain welded carbon quality light-walled steel pipe and tube, of rectangular (including square) cross section, having a wall thickness of less than 4 mm. For purposes of this investigation, the term "carbon-quality" steel includes both carbon steel and alloy steel which contain only small amounts of alloying elements. Specifically, the term "carbon-quality" includes only products in which none of the elements listed below exceeds the quantity by weight respectively indicated: 1.80 percent of manganese, or 2.25 percent of silicon, or 1.00 percent of copper, or 0.50 percent of aluminum, or 1.25 percent of chromium, or 0.30 percent of cobalt, or 0.40 percent of lead, or 1.25 percent of nickel, or 0.30 percent of tungsten, or 0.10 percent of molybdenum, or 0.10 percent of niobium, or 0.15 percent vanadium, or 0.15 percent of zirconium. This definition of carbon-quality is intended to identify the carbon-quality products that fall within the scope. LWRPT is currently classified under the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) subheadings 7306.61.50 and 7306.70.60 (limited to goods imported under statistical reporting number 7306.61.7060). While HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and Customs purposes, the written description of the scope of the order is dispositive.

<u>Firm</u>.--An individual proprietorship, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation (including any subsidiary corporation), business trust, cooperative, trustee in bankruptcy, or receiver under decree of any court.

Related firm.--A firm that your firm solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled; a firm that solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled your firm; and/or a firm that was solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled by a firm that also solely or jointly owned, managed, or otherwise controlled your firm.

<u>Establishment.</u>.--Each facility of a firm in each of the four subject countries involved in the production of LWRPT (as defined above), including auxiliary facilities operated in conjunction with (whether or not physically separate from) such facilities.

<u>United States</u>.--For purposes of this proceeding, the 50 States, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia.

<u>Importer</u>.--Any person or firm engaged, either directly or through a parent company or subsidiary, in importing LWRPT (as defined above) into the United States from a foreign manufacturer or through its selling agent.

<u>Average production capacity</u>.--The level of production that your establishment(s) could reasonably have expected to attain during the specified periods. Assume normal operating conditions (i.e., using equipment and machinery in place and ready to operate; normal operating levels (hours per week/weeks per year) and time for downtime, maintenance, repair, and cleanup; and a typical or representative light-walled rectangular pipe and tube mix).

<u>DEFINITIONS</u>--Continued

<u>Production</u>.--All production in your establishment(s) in China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey, including production consumed internally within your firm.

<u>Shipments</u>.--Shipments of LWRPT produced in your establishment(s) in China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey.

Shipment quantities.—Quantities reported should be net of returns.

<u>Shipment values</u>.—Values reported should be net values (i.e., gross sales values less all discounts, allowances, rebates, prepaid freight, and the value of returned goods) in <u>U.S. dollars</u>, f.o.b. your point of shipment in China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey.

Home market commercial shipments.--Shipments, other than internal consumption and transfers to related firms, within China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey.

<u>Home market internal consumption/transfers to related firms</u>.--Shipments made to related firms in China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey, including LWRPT consumed internally by your firm.

Export shipments.--Shipments to destinations outside China, Korea, Mexico, and Turkey, including shipments to related firms.

<u>Inventories</u>.--Finished goods inventory, not raw materials or work-in-progress.
