The United States International Trade Commission is investigating Cut-to-Length Carbon-Quality Steel Plate from India, Indonesia and Korea under the provisions of section 751 of the Tariff Act of 1930.

In this proceeding, the Commission must determine whether revocation of the countervailing and/or antidumping duty orders on Cut-to-Length Carbon-Quality Steel Plate from India, Indonesia and Korea would be likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of material injury to an industry in the United States within a reasonably foreseeable time.
