Pigment red 187 (CAS No. 59487-23-9) (provided for in subheading 3204.17.60)

Pigment red 187 is a synthetic organic chemical used in coloring plastics that are processed at over 200 °C. It has FDA approval for indirect food contact packaging. It is imported from Germany.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Pigment
Red 187.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PIGMENT RED 187.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.32.22 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/2002” and inserting “12/31/2006”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
8 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
10 January 1, 2003.
