Formulations of NOA 446510 which include NOA 446510 Technical,  
2-(4-chloro-phenyl)-N-[2-(3-methoxy-4-prop-2-ynyloxy-phenyl)ethyl]-2-prop-2-ynyloxyacetamide (CAS  
No. 374726-62-2) (provided for in subheading 3808.20.15)

**Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:**

Formulations of NOA 446510 is a mixture that contains a synthetic organic chemical used in the production of a new fungicide that provides better control than existing fungicides on late blight in potatoes and on downy mildew on a variety of crops. The new synthetic organic fungicide will provide an alternative mode of action to counteract the development of resistance of downy mildew to the strobiluron class of fungicides. The proponent will import this product from France beginning in 2008.

3 **SECTION 1. FORMULATIONS OF NOA 466510.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of  
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is  
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following:

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1       (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from  
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
