The Commission suggests that the article description on page 1 of this report be used in the proposed new heading in order to provide the more common chemical name and to provide the correct HTS subheading.

³ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

3 **SECTION 1. ACETOACET-O-CHLORO ANILIDE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:
