Nature of bill: Extension of existing temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2009.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Bifenazate (Hydrazinecarboxylic acid, 2-(4-methoxy-[1,1-biphenyl]-3-yl)-1-methylethyl ester (CAS No. 149877-41-8) (provided for in subheading 2928.00.25).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject chemical is a synthetic organic chemical. It is used in proprietary formulations to control mites, especially spider mites, red mites, and grass mites, on apples, pears, grapes, peaches, plums, strawberries, ornamentals, hops, and field-grown food crops. The subject product is imported from the Czech Republic and Germany.

A BILL

To extend temporarily the suspension of the duty on
Bifenazate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. BIFENAZATE.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Heading 9902.01.61 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking the date in the effective period column and
7 inserting “December 31, 2009”.

8 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
9 this section shall apply with respect to goods entered, or

- 1 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
- 2 the 15th day after the date of enactment of this Act.
