The subject product is an organic chemical that is used as a plant growth regulator primarily in potato and onion crops. It is also used on tobacco crops to prevent sucker development. The product is imported from Taiwan.

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

3 **SECTION 1. MALEIC HYDRAZIDE TECHNICAL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	1,2-dihydropyridazine-3,6- dione (CAS No. 123-33-1) (provided for in subheading 2933.99.97)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2011	”.
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1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn
3 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
