⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on 4-Anilino-3-nitro-N-phenylbenzenesulphonamide.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 4-ANILINO-3-NITRO-N-**
4 **PHENYLBENZENESULPHONAMIDE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.03.52 of the Har-
6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
7 4-Anilino-3-nitro-N-phenylbenzenesulphonamide) is
8 amended by striking “12/31/2006” and inserting “12/31/
9 2011”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
3 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
4 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
