Triphenyltin hydroxide (CAS No. 76-87-9) (provided for in subheading 2931.00.26).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject product is a synthetic organo-tin compound that is used as a fungicide to control blight, leaf spot, and other fungus diseases on a variety of agriculture products, including potatoes, sugar beets, and peanuts. The product is imported from China.

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on triphenyltin
hydroxide.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TRIPHENYLTIN HYDROXIDE.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Heading 9902.22.96 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 triphenyltin hydroxide) is amended by striking the date
7 in the effective period column and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from

- 1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
- 2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
