**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION
of the 111th Congress¹**

[Date approved: March 25, 2010]²

Bill No. and sponsor: S. 2437 (Mr. Sam Brownback of Kansas).

Proponent name,³ location: Spirit Aerosystems, Wichita, KS.

Other bills on product (111th Congress only): None.

Nature of bill: Extension of temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.⁴

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Exterior lights designed for illuminating aircraft evacuation routes or slides (provided for in subheading 9405.40.60).

Check one: Same as that in bill as introduced.
 Different from that in bill as introduced (see Technical comments section).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

These exterior lights are used on aircraft to illuminate emergency escape routes over the wings and the slides or chutes which deploy during emergency landings. The primary source of imports is Japan.

It is suggested that the language of the proposed article description be modified as shown on page 1. This language is intended to take into account the nature of the products imported by the proponent, which imports goods not covered by HTS heading 9902.22.85.

However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

To modify and extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain emergency illumination lights designed for use in aircraft.

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN EMERGENCY ILLUMINATION LIGHTS**
4 **DESIGNED FOR USE IN AIRCRAFT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.22.85 of the Har-
6 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
7 certain lights designed for use in aircraft) is amended—

8 (1) by striking the article description and in-
9 serting the following: “Exterior aircraft lights for il-

1 illuminating emergency escape routes and slides (pro-
2 vided for in subheading 9405.40.60)”; and

3 (2) by striking “12/31/2009” and inserting
4 “12/31/2011”.

5 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
6 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered, or
7 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
8 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
