The subject product is an additive which imparts antimicrobial properties to consumer products and medical devices. The product is imported from Japan.

3 **SECTION 1. SILVER SODIUM HYDROGEN ZIRCONIUM PHOS-**
4 **PHATE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:
