**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION
of the 111th Congress¹**

Bill No. and sponsor: S. 2542 (Ms. Maria Cantwell of Washington).

Proponent name,³ location: Outdoor Industry Association, Boulder, CO.

Other bills on product (111th Congress only): None.

Nature of bill: Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Men's wading boots, valued over \$30/pair, with outer soles of rubber, plastics, leather or composition leather and uppers of rubber or plastics, whose height from the bottom of the outer sole to the top of the upper does not exceed 22.9 cm (provided for in subheading 6402.91.90).

Check one: Same as that in bill as introduced.
 Different from that in bill as introduced (see Technical comments section).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

The subject men's footwear is designed for wading or other outdoor uses. The bill's proponent estimates that less than 1 percent of imports under HTS subheading 6402.91.90 are intended for such outdoor uses. The primary import source is China.

It is suggested that the article description of the proposed heading be amended to read as shown on page 1. The description should not contain the English unit of measure used in the bill because the HTS uses metric units of measure.

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain men's wading boots, valued over \$30/pair, with outer soles of rubber, plastics, leather, or composition leather and uppers of rubber or plastics whose height from the bottom of the outer sole to the top of the upper does not exceed 9 inches (22.86 cm).

1 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN MEN’S WADING BOOTS, VALUED OVER**
 2 **\$30/PAIR, WITH OUTER SOLES OF RUBBER,**
 3 **PLASTICS, LEATHER, OR COMPOSITION**
 4 **LEATHER AND UPPERS OF RUBBER OR PLAS-**
 5 **TICS WHOSE HEIGHT FROM THE BOTTOM OF**
 6 **THE OUTER SOLE TO THE TOP OF THE UPPER**
 7 **DOES NOT EXCEED 9 INCHES (22.86 CM).**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
 9 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
 10 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
 11 new heading:

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12 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
 13 subsection (a) applies to goods entered, or withdrawn from
