**MEMORANDUM ON PROPOSED TARIFF LEGISLATION
of the 111th Congress ¹**

[Date approved: April 16, 2010]²

Bill No. and sponsor: S. 2603 (Mr. Harry Reid of Nevada).

Proponent name,³ location: Industrial Adventures, Las Vegas, NV.

Other bills on product (111th Congress only): None.⁴

Nature of bill: Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Caps or lids with threads on the inner surfaces of their lips or rims (including perforated caps or lids of a type and size suitable for use on salt or pepper shakers, cheese shakers or similar containers), designed for bottles having threads on the outer surfaces of their necks or mouths, such caps or lids of base metal plated with chromium or gold (provided for in subheading 8309.90.00).

Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

These base-metal caps are distinguished by threads on the inner rim that allow the cap to be screwed onto, or off of, the threaded neck or mouth of a bottle or shaker. The chromium or gold surface-plating is not only decorative but also protects the underlying base metal (usually steel) from rust or corrosion, avoiding potential contamination of the bottle's or shaker's contents. Bottle caps have solid surfaces and lack the perforations that characterize shaker caps. However, the subject goods would not include non-threaded, non-reusable "crown caps," the fluted types of lift-off bottle caps commonly used on beverage bottles, which are likely classified in HTS subheading 8309.10.00.

³ The sponsor/proponent did not identify any additional beneficiaries of this bill. USITC staff identified seven additional potential beneficiaries of this bill that were not identified by the sponsor/proponent, but none of them submitted a written representation that it would benefit from this bill.

Technical comments:⁵

It is suggested that the article description of the proposed heading be amended to read as shown on page 1. As noted above, it is difficult to distinguish between the coverage intended by this bill and that proposed by S. 2604, and the proponent has not supplied information to help in differentiating the classes of goods concerned. The proposed language shown above represents one way to cover a different class of goods than would fall into the heading proposed in S. 2604, but we are not sure if this language matches proponent's intent.

We note that some bottle caps and shaker caps are not separately imported but are shipped with or attached to the bottles for which they are intended. These caps would likely be classified under the applicable HTS subheadings for the bottles and shakers of glass (or of other materials) that they accompany, and would therefore not be eligible for duty-free entry under this proposed heading.⁶

The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.

To suspend temporarily the duty on screw-on bottle caps and shaker caps with chromium or gold plated finish.

3 **SECTION 1. SCREW-ON BOTTLE CAPS AND SHAKER CAPS**

4 **WITH CHROMIUM OR GOLD PLATED FINISH.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
8 new heading:

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1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
