Nature of bill: Temporary duty suspension through December 31, 2011.

Retroactive effect: None.

#### Suggested article description(s) for enactment (including appropriate HTS subheading(s)):

Low molecular weight ethylenimine copolymers, 1,2-ethanediamine, polymer with aziridine (CAS No. 25987-06-8), whether in aqueous solution or water free grades (provided for in subheading 3911.90.90).

### Product information, including uses/applications and source(s) of imports:

Low molecular weight ethylenimine copolymers in pure form are colorless to pale yellow, viscous liquids that are highly soluble in water. The products act as an excellent thermosetting agent which promotes adhesion of wood laminates, cement, and bricks. The products also promote adhesion to metal surfaces, improve corrosion inhibitors, and solubilize metal cations. They also act as a fixing agent to bind and retain hair treatments, conditioners, shampoos, wave setting preparations, dyes, and straighteners. The products are also used for the lamination or sealing of food packaging items, in resinous and polymeric coatings for polyolefin films to anchor epoxy surface coatings to base sheet, and as a component of paper and paperboard in contact with dry food. The proponent imports the subject products from its plant in Germany.

The Commission staff suggests that the article description on page 1 of this report be used in the new heading to more accurately describe the specific grades and chemical nomenclature of products subject to this bill. The proponent's public information website advertises ten different grades of polyethylenimines, only four of which are specified under the given Chemical Abstracts Service (CAS) number described in this legislation. The other six grades are described under other CAS numbers.
