4 United States International Trade Commission, I welcome you
5 to this hearing on Investigation No. TA-204-10, Certain
6 Circular Welded Carbon Quality Line Pipe: Evaluation of the
7 Effectiveness of Import Relief.

8 On February 18, 2000, the President pursuant to
9 Section 203 of the Trade Act of 1974, issued a proclamation
10 to facilitate positive adjustment to competition from
11 imports of Certain Circular Welded Carbon Quality Line Pipe,
12 imposed import relief for a period of three years in one
13 day, effective March 1, 2000.

14 On March 1, 2003, the import relief terminated.
15 Following termination, the Commission is required by Section
16 204D of the Act, instituted Investigation No. TA-204-10, to
17 evaluate the effectiveness of the action in facilitating
18 positive adjustment by the domestic line pipe industry to
19 import competition.

20 The appearances for this hearing were due on June
21 18, 2003, and as of that date, the Commission had received
