5 And I'd like to take this opportunity to
6 introduce Mahir Torsekar, who has been our industry
7 analyst on the final phase of the investigation. This
8 is his first Title VII investigation. Nothing like a
9 nice, simple starter case.

10 As you can expect, and this may be true for
11 all of you, we're all happy that we won't be looking
12 at any more Black Friday ads and will be able to march
13 through an appliance store simply observing the
14 product and not thinking of scope/in scope, subject/
15 nonsubject. With that, back to you.
